



ACEC PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

General

- ACEC is about to launch its new emerging leaders program ("Pathways to Executive Leadership") which will hold several sessions at the Fall Conference in Colorado, followed by a series of online classes, and concluding with advocacy-oriented sessions at the Spring Convention in Washington.
- ACEC's employee strength has grown to 575,000 the highest level in the Council's 107-year history; ACEC member firms now also make up 82 percent of eligible firms on the ENR 500, including nine out of the top ten.
- ACEC member firms have also grown faster than non-ACEC firms over the past four years, according to a recent analysis of the ENR 500 rankings.

Government Advocacy

- The House Transportation & Infrastructure Committee approved a draft Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) that authorizes \$5 billion for 28 new Corps of Engineers projects around the country. (A more expansive bill passed earlier by the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee includes ACEC-backed language to expand QBS, as well as provisions authorizing new Corps projects, funding to address drinking water needs, and the creation of a water trust fund.)
- ACEC's Action Alert promoting a permanent revenue solution for the Highway Trust Fund helped to persuade 130 Members of Congress to sign a letter to Ways & Means Committee leaders recommending that transportation funding options be included in tax reform.
- Secured language in the 2017 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) passed by the House that will prevent the Department of Defense from implementing the so-called "blacklisting" rule.
- The Federal Acquisition Regulatory (FAR) Council issued a final rule on design-build that codifies an ACEC-backed policy to limit Design-Build two-phase finalists to five teams.
- ACEC-backed legislation introduced by Rep. Mark Meadows (R-NC) to limit the use of reverse auctions and one-phase design-build was approved by a House committee.
- Asked Congress to extend the Section 179D energy efficient commercial buildings tax deduction beyond the end of 2016.
- Strongly supported allowing engineering firms to continue using the cash method of accounting in a letter to the Senate Finance Committee.
- ACEC/PAC co-hosted fundraising events for Representatives Earl Blumenauer (D-OR), Bob Dold (R-IL), John Duncan (R-TN), Nydia Velazquez (D-NY), Daniel Webster (R-FL), Bruce Westerman (R-AR), and Mo Brooks (R-AL), and U.S. Senator Pat Leahy (D-VT).

- Held ACEC's highly regarded Expert Witness course, Applying Expertise as an Engineering Expert Witness, in which technical professionals honed their skills at providing effective testimony as engineering experts.
- Coalitions' best sellers for May included CASE's A Guideline Addressing the Preparation of Structural Engineering Reports for Buildings and CAMEE's Agreement between MEP Engineer and Consulting Design Professional, both available at www.acec.org/bookstore.
- With 30 registered sites, May's most popular online class, Emerging Trends in Compensation, examined rising compensation trends and job growth activity in the A/E/C industry and the impact on member firms.
- The education management system RCEP added two new Approved Providers –Post Tensioning Institute and Philips Lighting for a total of 130.
